# **GOOD STANDING POLICY**

## **GOOD STANDING**

**Rationale:** GOOD STANDING is a status which is held by all students.

It is related to their ATTENDANCE, BEHAVIOUR and COURSE PARTICIPATION.

The aim of GOOD STANDING is to encourage students to take greater responsibility for their attendance, behaviour, and course participation at school and therefore their education.

The term 'school' is in reference to Champion Bay Senior High School.

#### THE GOOD STANDING SYSTEM

Across all years, the Good Standing policy has three types of status:

- Good Standing is in place all students are considered as being in GOOD STANDING at the commencement of each year. A student has good standing until they choose to have their Good Standing withdrawn or removed.
- Withdrawn for a five week period if they do not meet the attendance target, receive an in-school withdrawal (ISW), or fail to submit assessments. Students must show that they have made changes to try to regain Good Standing.
- Removed if they are Suspended.

Whether or not a student retains this status during the year depends on a number of factors outlined below:

**ATTENDANCE**: a student's attendance must be 90% or above to still hold GOOD STANDING. This data is analysed every 5 weeks.

**BEHAVIOUR:** as an addition to the behaviour component of the GOOD STANDING policy, if a student is suspended for any reason, they will lose GOOD STANDING for a period of 5-10 weeks at the discretion of the Principal.

**COURSE PARTICIPATION:** students must complete assessments in a timely manner and meet all deadlines.

### NOTE:

- 1. When ISWs are issued and parents are contacted, the Good Standing process will be discussed.
- 2. Students who have GOOD STANDING withdrawn are excluded from school based activities (e.g. Interschool Carnivals, Lightning Carnivals, celebration events) and extra-curricular and celebration activities (functions held outside of school hours e.g. Countryweek, Camps, Spring Dance, School Ball) until the next review of Good Standing or until the reason/s for not having good standing has been resolved, which includes completing an Action plan with the assistance of their Team Leader, Year Coordinator or the Student Services Manager for their year group.
- 3. Students may be suspended from school at any stage of the Behaviour Management process. On return to school the student will lose GOOD STANDING and will be excluded from extra-curricular activities for a period of 5-10 weeks (at the discretion of the Principal). To have GOOD STANDING reinstated, a student must complete these weeks with no further negative behaviours recorded, and maintain attendance and course participation. An application in writing is made to the Principal for reinstatement of GOOD STANDING. This application must be received and approved by the Principal.
